






Inspiration Pictures

Background




The first thing I did was mask the houses and separate them a bit. I then added in a new sky, the nice neighborhood across the street and my cash for homes sign. This is a rough sketch with some adjustment layers and maksking needed.




I added the moving truck, the running woman, and a man who looked sad. The images still look a bit like they were cut and pasted as there are no adjustment layers added.



I added some adjustment layers to blend this well. I also added an eviction notice to the house of the man to tell more of a story.



I changed the color of the cash for homes sign and added some buildings under construction. This added element helps tell the story of investment in downtown areas while poor people are uncared for.



I changed the sky to add to the comber mood of the composition. The story plays out well here, showing the investment and high income people building up their city and gentrifying the poor people out of the homes they've lived in for the longest time.



Final

Just when I thought I was done, I realized a small detail. If you look at the house on the left, the house I lived in projects its shadow onto it. The shadows of the people go in the same direction, however, the shadow of the building on the previous page did not go that way so I flipped both of the buildings and played around with their heights until I was satisfied.

I like the buildings this way better anyways as they seem to be looking down on the man being evicted with the Cash 4 Homes sign.
